When I was a kid, my friends and I ruled the afterschool football games. Even in second grade, we were beating fourth and fifth graders. Why? Because we tried. We were fast, had designed plays, and worked as a team. But our biggest advantage? We had our own football.

Why was that such a big deal? Well, whenever the older kids started winning and we got frustrated, we'd just take our ball and head in. In our minds, if we quit before the game was over, it didn't count as a loss. Sound familiar? Many of you probably knew that one kid who, when things didn't go his way, simply took his ball and left. The problem is, this same mentality follows many people into adulthood. I'm not talking about NFL quarterbacks storming off the field or baseball players packing up their bats, I'm talking about real life. Too often, when things get tough or uncomfortable, people walk away rather than face the challenge.

This mindset mirrors what Paul warned about in 2 Timothy 4:3-4, "For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths." Sometimes, the truth isn't what we want to hear-but it's what we need to hear. Growth, especially spiritual growth, isn't always comfortable. We often want the rewards of faith without the struggles that come with it. It's easier to justify our choices than to humble ourselves before God and His truth. It's easier to rewrite the rules than to go through the painful process of changing our hearts to reflect Christ. But Scripture doesn't sugarcoat things. Hebrews 4:12-13 describes God's word as **a sword**—not a feather duster to tickle our ears, not a pillow for a slumber party, but a sharp, piercing blade that cuts deep to expose our hearts: "For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart. And no creature is hidden from his sight, but all are

naked and exposed to the eyes of him to whom we must give account."

That's the reality of God's truth. It challenges us, convicts us, and corrects us. As 2 Timothy 3:16-17 says, "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work." What does that mean for us? Well, If we truly want to follow Christ, we must be willing to hear all of God's word-not just the parts that make us feel good. It might hurt, but that pain leads to growth and healing. After all, Christ endured the agony of scourging and crucifixion so that we could be healed. Isaiah 53:5 reminds us that, "He was pierced for our transgressions; He was crushed for our iniquities; upon Him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with His wounds we are healed."

But healing only comes when we follow Him. Jesus made it clear in Matthew 7:21, "Not everyone who says to me, "Lord, Lord," will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven." God calls us to fight against sin—even when it's uncomfortable. He commands us to teach and embrace the whole counsel of God (Acts 20:27), not just the parts that are easy to accept. Unfortunately, many people today seek out preachers who only tell them what they want to hear. But when Scripture challenges our desires, we don't get to take our ball and find a new game. Instead, we must **repent** and turn back to God. As Jesus says in Revelation 3:19, "Those whom I love, I reprove and discipline, so be zealous and repent." True faith means staying in the game, even when it's tough and obeying all that we are to follow. Don't walk away from the hard truths. Let them refine you, shape you, and bring you closer to Christ.
