GOD ABOVE ALL

This past week, Answers in Genesis posted a YouTube video featuring an interview with Joel Leineweber, one of their dinosaur reconstruction illustrators for the Ark Encounter. In the video, Leineweber exposes the flaws in mainstream dinosaur reconstructions, showing how many depictions contradict fossil evidence.

One of the most fascinating points he makes is how an artist's perspective shapes their reconstruction. Throughout the video, he walks viewers through his process of recreating *Sinornithosaurus*, comparing his biblically grounded approach to secular, evolutionary interpretations. The differences are striking.

At the start, mainstream illustrations depict *Sinornithosaurus* as a raptor-like creature with long arms and feathery head tufts, picture a mullet-wearing dinosaur! But by the end, Leineweber demonstrates that, when viewed through a biblical lens rather than an evolutionary one, the fossil record suggests it wasn't a feathered dinosaur at all, but an ancient bird resembling a heron. This video is a powerful reminder of how worldviews shape interpretations of evidence, and I highly recommend watching it.

This video also highlights a bigger issue: when we divide the secular and spiritual in our minds, the secular inevitably takes over, and we see this playing out in our society today. For example, In science, God is often excluded from discussions, as faith is seen as incompatible with reason and evidence. While science seeks to explain the natural world, Christians must not fall into the trap of thinking the "natural" exists apart from God. Without God, there is no nature. "For by Him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through Him and for Him." (Colossians 1:16)

In education, religion seems to also have very little footing and influence. While there are exceptions, teachers are generally not allowed to express their faith openly. Those who do face an uphill battle, as the divide between secular and spiritual makes it harder to stand firm. But I encourage all those who are to continue to stand firm in the faith.(1 Corinthians 16:13) This same divide is seen in government as well, where laws are increasingly made without consideration for biblical values. The First Amendment's "no establishment of religion" clause has been twisted to mean that religion must stay out of government, rather than preventing government from interfering with religion. Meanwhile, the idea of "separation of church and state"—a phrase found nowhere in the Constitution—is used to justify prioritizing the state over faith.

In culture, believers are often seen as less intelligent or influential than those with a secular mindset. A secular culture naturally swallows up the spiritual, but this one shouldn't surprise us as Christians. After all, Paul explained to the church in Corinth, that "God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, even things that are not, to bring to nothing things that are, so that no human being might boast in the presence of God." (**1 Corinthians 1:27-29**)

As Christians, we must reject the false divide between secular and spiritual. When culture leads and faith follows, the consequences are serious. If we allow the spiritual to be sidelined, we also push aside God's influence in our lives. Modernism, postmodernism, and scientism all work to diminish God's role. Too often, we focus on avoiding legalism and Pharisaism while overlooking the equally dangerous issue of a powerless faith, modern-day Sadduceeism.

As Christians, Christ must be the center our lives! Paul says, in **Colossians 3:1-4**, "If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with Him in glory." Every decision, every lesson, every role as a citizen, and every moment of rest should be centered on Him. We never separate our lives from the Lord. Everything we do is for His glory and in His name.

2 Corinthians 10:4-5 says, "For the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh but have divine power to destroy strongholds. We destroy arguments and every lofty opinion raised against the knowledge of God, and take every thought captive to obey Christ" Let us make sure that we have not let the world, and the view of secularism overshadow God's absolute grace, power, and glory in our lives. **Andrew Spivey**
