With the wild weather we've had this past week, meteorologists definitely had their hands full. On Wednesday, April 2<sup>nd</sup> alone, there were 53 tornado warnings, 20 flash flood warnings, and 70 severe thunderstorm warnings issued. The storms were so intense and relentless, they even drained the batteries on Nashville's tornado sirens from overuse. Through it all, I'm incredibly grateful for the meteorologists who worked tirelessly to track the chaos and keep us informed and safe, because it hasn't always been that way.

Throughout history, humanity has been fascinated by the weather, and has tried to predict it in every way possible. As far back as 650 B.C., the ancient Babylonians attempted short-term forecasts by observing cloud patterns and optical phenomena like haloes around the moon and stars. By 340 B.C., the Greek philosopher Aristotle had written Meteorologica, a four-volume work on weather theory. While some of his insights were remarkable, many were flawed. Nevertheless, his writings stood as the foundation of meteorological thought for over 2,000 years.

Over generations, people have passed down weatherrelated sayings and rhymes in hopes of making sense of nature's moods. Consider the old proverb: "Red sky at night, sailor's delight; red sky in the morning, sailor's warning." This saying even dates back to biblical times and is referenced in Matthew 16:2-3. Books like the Farmer's Almanac became treasured guides, helping people decide when to plant crops or brace for changing seasons.

Fast forward to today, and we live in a time where science and technology allow us to predict weather patterns with Kevin, Angie & Emily Siler need help with moving small astonishing accuracy. We tune into the news or check our phones to see if we need an umbrella or a jacket. Yet, no matter how advanced our forecasts become, or how primitive they once were, one truth remains unchanged: weather has always been under the sovereign hand of God.

In the book of Job, Elihu, one of Job's friends, speaks powerfully about God's control over nature. Job 37:3-6 says, "Under the whole heaven he lets it go, and his lightning to the corners of the earth. After it his voice roars; he thunders with his majestic voice, and he does not restrain the lightning when his voice is heard. God thunders wondrously with his voice; he does great things that we cannot comprehend. For to the snow he says, 'Fall on the earth,' likewise to the downpour, his mighty downpour." From Genesis to Revelation, and in our everyday lives, we see how God uses weather to fulfill His purposes. The cycle of the seasons; rain, sunshine, warmth, and cold, enables the earth to flourish and sustain life. After the flood, God made a promise to Noah and all mankind in Genesis 8:22, "While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease."

In Exodus, God sent a devastating hailstorm to Egypt to display His power and bring judgment upon Pharaoh's hard-heartedness (Exodus 9:13-35). In Jonah, God used a violent storm to redirect the runaway prophet, ensuring His divine plan would unfold (Jonah 1:4). In Job 38, God Himself speaks of His authority over the elements: "Who has cleft a channel for the torrents of rain and a way for the thunderbolt, to bring rain on a land where no man is, on the desert in which there is no man, to satisfy the waste and desolate land, and to make the ground sprout with grass?" (Job 38:25-27) God reveals that even in the most barren places, where no one is watching, He sends rain simply to glorify Himself.

Psalm 148 reminds us that all creation: lightning, hail, snow, mist, and stormy winds, obey God and fulfill His word. Then, perhaps one of the clearest signs of Jesus' divinity was when He calmed a raging storm with just His voice. In awe, the disciples asked in Matthew 8:27, "What sort of man is this, that even winds and sea obey him?" So the next time you see the radar light up with swirling colors or hear a meteorologist predict a coming storm, don't just think of science, think of sovereignty. Behind every front, every breeze, and every bolt of lightning is the hand of the Creator. We may not always understand why the weather does what it does, but we can be confident in who controls **Andrew Spivey** it.
