BECOME LIKE CHILDREN

As Lads to Leaders approaches this week and our young people wrap up their preparations for the convention, I'm filled with fond memories of my own time participating in Lads to Leaders while growing up. I remember the effort my family and I poured into it each year to help make it a success. Now, as an adult looking back, I'm even more amazed to witness our children, and so many others from different congregations, gathering at the Opryland Hotel, all eager to glorify God and share His word. Events like Lads to Leaders remind me why Jesus so often used children to teach us how we are meant to be.

On two powerful occasions, Jesus used the innocence of little children to reveal some of the clearest and most profound truths about the kind of heart required to enter the kingdom of heaven. These moments are recorded in Matthew 18 and 19, as well as in other gospel accounts. Through them, Jesus clearly demonstrated what God desires each of us to become. We've all sung the words, "Jesus loves the little children of the world," but Jesus didn't just sing it, He lived it.

On one occasion, while Jesus was teaching a crowd, some people brought their children to Him. The disciples tried to turn them away, but Jesus stopped everything to welcome the little ones. In **Mark 10:15** He said, "Truly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it." Jesus didn't just speak of love, He showed it. The gospel accounts tell us He interacted personally with the children: He lifted them up, placed them in the midst of His disciples for all to see, held them in His arms, laid His hands on them, and blessed them.

Imagine the memories those children carried for the rest of their lives. Years later, a grandfather might have said, "I was there when Jesus used my five loaves and two fish to feed a crowd." Or perhaps someone joyfully recalled, "When I was a child, I sat in Jesus' lap." These are not only touching moments, but they are also powerful reminders that children are not just learners; they are teachers of the very lessons Jesus taught.

First, consider that children are born innocent. They do not inherit sin, nor are they born with a sinful nature. At birth, children are just as innocent as Jesus was when He entered the world. Baby Jesus was not a sinner, nor did He possess a sinful nature. As **Hebrews 4:15** reminds us, "For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin." Jesus

also said in **Matthew 18:3**, "Truly, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." Children are not evil, and they do not have an evil nature. That is why Jesus said we must become like them.

Children are a living example of the kind of heart we must cultivate. They embody humility, trust, and a pure desire to follow. If you read the account in **Matthew 18**, you'll find that the disciples were arguing over who would be the greatest in the kingdom. Jesus responded by using a child as an object lesson. He placed a child before them and said, "Unless you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." Then He added, "Whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven." (**Matthew 18:4**)

Jesus went on to say that to receive a child is to receive Him. (Matthew 18:5) He also described God's anger over those who destroy that child's innocent faith. In Matthew 18:6 Jesus said, "but whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him to have a great millstone fastened around his neck and to be drowned in the depth of the sea." Jesus even went on to say, "See that you do not despise one of these little ones. For I tell you that in heaven their angels always see the face of my Father who is in heaven." (Matthew 18:10) Imagine that! Children have angels who watch over them and report to God how they are treated. But just as they report harm, they also witness and remember the good you do in teaching and guiding them.

So, take time to really *see* children, not just with your eyes, but with your heart. Learn from them. Become like them. Because Jesus said, "Unless you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven."

That's why I am so thankful for the support we have and offer here at Nashville Road through programs like Lads to Leaders, as well as others such as Truth Seekers, Tuesday Nights Together, Vacation Bible School, and more. If you're looking for an opportunity to learn from our children and grow in childlike faith, I encourage you to come watch our youth this weekend at Lads to Leaders. I know you'll be glad you did.
