Speaking of awards and rewards, have you noticed how almost every company today is offering some sort of "rewards program?" Of course, airlines have been giving out "frequent flyer miles" for years, but now businesses of all kinds have joined in. You can't get a cup of coffee, pump your gas, or buy groceries without having to type in your phone number or scan a rewards card.

The premise is simple: the more you do, the more you get. The more you spend, the more you earn. For businesses, it's a smart way to encourage loyalty and boost sales. For customers, it's an exciting way to get a little extra just for doing what they're already doing. But this brings up an interesting question, do some people view the Christian life the same way? Do we sometimes slip into the mindset that our faith is like a "Rewards Program?" That the more we do for God, the more blessings we'll earn? That being a Christian is about "what's in it for me?"

The Bible certainly speaks of rewards both here on earth, and in eternity. Jesus tells us in **John 10:10** that He came so that we "may have life and have it abundantly". Jesus also says in **Matthew 16:27**, "For the Son of Man is going to come with his angels in the glory of his Father, and then he will repay each person according to what he has done." It's incredibly encouraging to know that when we are in Christ, we are rewarded on both heaven and earth. But is that the main reason we follow Him?

We must remember we can never earn enough "points" to put God in our debt. Everything He gives, both in this life and in eternity, is a gift freely given through His amazing grace. **Ephesians 2:8** says, "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own

doing; it is the gift of God." Paul also explains to Timothy, in 1 Timothy 1:12-15 of how he was once a persecutor of the church and an opponent of Christ but received mercy "and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the foremost." (1 Timothy 1:14-15)

So why do we serve, follow, give, love, and worship the Lord? Is it simply for the rewards? Or is it because we love Him deeply, personally, and passionately? God calls us to live with *agape* love at the center of all we do. It's love that gives without expecting anything in return. It's selfless, sacrificial, and focused on others. **1 Corinthians 16:14** says, "Let all that you do be done in love." That kind of love shifts our focus from *getting* to *giving*. That's not just a nice sentiment; it's a call to action. We're not meant to serve God for what we *get*, but because of how deeply we *love* Him.

Let us make sure not to treat our faith like a rewards card. Let's not do more just to get more. Instead, let's love more, give more, and serve more because He is worthy, and because our love for Him grows stronger every single day. Romans 6:23 "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." Let us also remember that we could never earn our own spot in heaven, but through Christ we have the promise of an eternal reward.
