#### TIME

As I celebrated my birthday this past week, I realized I've definitely, reached the age where birthdays just aren't as thrilling as they used to be. I can still remember the excitement of my younger days, when my parents would rent out a restaurant to throw a party, or when we hosted celebrations at our house, filled with tons of friends. The best part? My closest friends would get to stay the night, and we'd spend hours playing with all my new toys. This year, though, was much quieter, just a simple, sweet evening at home with Taylor, Palmer, and Rhett. And honestly, I loved it.

Reflecting on my birthday made me think about how fascinating time is, especially when you compare our view of it to God's. What feels like a lifetime to us is just a moment to Him. Time, to God, is nothing like time to us. Peter reminds us, in

**2 Peter 3:8**, "But do not overlook this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day." Our God lives in what I have heard called an "eternal present," a reality where past, present, and future are always before Him. We, however, experience time very differently. Our view of time is linear, and how fast we travel on that line depends on several factors.

Think about it: how long is a year to you? If you're like Rhett, and not even a year old yet, then a year is literally your entire lifetime, it must feel enormous for him! But if you're fifty, a year is just one-fiftieth of your life, which doesn't seem quite as significant. The older we get; the faster time seems to fly. And the longer we are on this earth, the faster time tends to go. But that is the relentless, fleeting nature of time.

In the Bible, we see other perspectives of time. For example, in **Genesis 29:20** we learn that, although Jacob worked for seven years to marry Rachel, the scripture tells us that time felt like nothing for him. It is amazing how time can feel short or long, depending entirely on the perspective of one's heart. Just like how vacations always seem too short, and work or school days can seem to go so long. The Psalmist also shows us the importances of reflecting on how we use our time. In **Psalm 90:10-12** we read, "The years of our life are seventy, or even by reason of strength eighty; yet their span is but toil and trouble; they are soon gone, and we fly away. Who considers the power of your anger, and your wrath according to the fear of you? So, teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom." Time is a fascinating thing. How long is a day? A month? A decade? It all depends on how you look at it.

But here's the real question: how long is a lifetime compared to eternity? It's as quick as the blink of an eye. James puts it plainly in **James 4:14**, "What is your life? For you are a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes." How foolish it would be to focus only on material things during these fleeting earthly years! Let's make sure we use every day to treasure what truly matters: to grow in the knowledge of God and His Kingdom.

And ultimately, the greatest question about time is this: why have we been given it at all? Thankfully, God gives us the answer. Acts 17:26-27 tells us, "He made from one man every nation of mankind to live on all the face of the earth, having determined allotted periods and the boundaries of their dwelling place, that they should seek God, and perhaps feel their way toward Him and find Him. Yet He is actually not far from each one of us." God placed us here, determined our time and place, and gave us this fleeting life for a purpose: to seek Him, to grow in love, knowledge, and obedience, and ultimately to be reunited with Him for eternity.
