THE BRIDGE IS COMPLETE

On May 27, 1937, over 200,000 people gathered in San Francisco for "Pedestrian Day". This day marked the grand opening of the Golden Gate Bridge. Stretching 4,200 feet across the Golden Gate Strait, this breathtaking structure connected San Francisco to Marin County and marked a stunning feat of engineering and foresight. Today, we may not fully appreciate the magnitude of the Golden Gate Bridge, especially with so many larger and longer bridges now in existence across America, but for more than 50 years before it became a reality, the idea of building such a bridge was considered impossible.

The concept of bridging the nearly mile-wide Golden Gate Strait was proposed as early as 1872, but it was not until 1921 when Cincinnati-born bridge engineer Joseph Strauss submitted a preliminary proposal and became the recognized leader of the effort to bridge the Golden Gate Strait. Today, the Golden Gate Bridge stands not merely a structure, but a symbol of vision, endurance, and unity. This bridge also offers us a powerful spiritual illustration of the gospel.

Just as for decades before, bridging the Golden Gate Strait seemed impossible, in much the same way, the divide between the sins of mankind and God also once appeared impossible to bridge. No amount of good deeds, religion, or moral effort could span the chasm our sin created. It didn't matter what man did to try and cover up their sins or make payment for them, there was nothing that could be done to connect sinful man with a Just God.

Enter God's perfect plan: not steel cables and towers, but a cross. As **Romans 5:6** declares, "For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly." The cross became the ultimate bridge, built not with human hands, but with divine mercy. Scripture tells us, "For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus" (1 Timothy 2:5). Jesus became the only way across the gap, and that way is now open to all.

But how do we cross this spiritual bridge? Through faith and obedience in Christ. Jesus says in John 15:13-14, "Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you." So, what are the commands that Jesus tells us? In John 5:24, Jesus says, "Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life." The first step across that bridge Nashville Rd. the kingdom of heaven is at hand." To cross that bridge, we must repent of our sins and follow Him.

Jesus also tells us that "everyone who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven" (Matthew 10:32) We must confess Jesus as Lord and Master and share that knowledge with others. Then, before Jesus ascended into Heaven, He tells us, ""All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:18-20) To cross that bridge, we must be baptized in Christ, leaving behind the old life of sin and entering a new life with God.

As Romans 6:4 beautifully states, "We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead ... we too might walk in newness of life." Baptism is not the end of the journey, it is the beginning of walking in fellowship with God, having crossed from death to life." But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ" (Ephesians 2:13)

Like the first pedestrians in 1937, we're invited to walk confidently across the bridge of grace-leaving the old behind and stepping into new life with God. And Jesus made it clear: "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" (John 14:6). He is the bridge. He is the only way. The bridge is complete. The way is open. Will you cross? **Andrew Spivey**
