# OUR ANCHOR AND GUIDE

Just over a month ago, I decided to plant some green bean seeds. It brought back memories of planting seeds with my parents when I was younger. These days, though, I've gotten used to the convenience of buying plants that are already well on their way to growing. Watering the soil every day and waiting for the first little sprout to break through the surface felt like a long wait but now comes the really hard part: waiting for the plant to actually produce beans. As I have struggled to patiently wait on the plants, checking them every day to see if there is any progress, I have realized how much our fastpaced society has truly influenced my mind, and maybe even my relationship with God.

We live in a world that constantly encourages instant gratification. Whether it's fast food, next-day delivery, or immediate access to entertainment, we're used to getting what we want without having to wait. But when it comes to following God, that mindset doesn't always apply. James reminds us of this. In **James 5:7-8** we read, "Be patient, therefore, brothers, until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth, being patient about it, until it receives the early and the late rain. You also, be patient. Establish your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is at hand."

James gives us a simple but powerful image in this farmer. One who puts in long days planting and weeding but then comes the hardest part: the waiting. He doesn't expect fruit overnight. He trusts the process and waits for the right season. That's what our journey through faith often looks like. We labor, we pray, and then we wait. God is at work, even if we can't always see it.

There are great blessings promised to those who learn to wait on the Lord. The Bible is full of them. David says, in **Psalm 37:34**, "Wait for the Lord and keep his way, and he will exalt you to inherit the land." **Proverbs 20:22** also reminds us not to take revenge but to trust God to make things right: "Do not say, 'I will repay evil;' wait for the Lord, and he will deliver you." When we're tired and worn down, **Isaiah 40:31** offers hope: "But they who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint".

Even when it feels like God is silent, we're not forgotten. **Micah 7:7** tells us, "But as for me, I will look to the Lord; I will wait for the God of my salvation; my God will hear me". Paul reminds us, our ultimate hope lies in the return of Jesus: "But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ" (**Philippians 3:20**). But how should we respond while we wait?

Waiting doesn't mean doing nothing. It means continuing to seek God, trusting Him, and doing what is right. Lamentations 3:25 says, "The Lord is good to those who wait for him, to the soul who seeks him." Paul encourages us in Galatians 6:9, "And let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up." David knew this well. He wrote, "Be still before the Lord and wait patiently for him" (Psalm 37:7). Even when the waiting feels long or difficult, we

are not without hope. Psalm 130:5 says, "I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in his word I hope." That hope anchors our souls, holding us steady through every trial. It is this hope that is the anchor of our souls and reaches far beyond a present trial. It reaches beyond the veil into the heavens (Hebrews 6:19-20). By faith we look upward and see our Savior sitting there. He is our forerunner waiting for our arrival. Let our prayer be for the Lord to help us be patient. To teach us to trust in Him and His perfect timing. To strengthen our hearts as we wait for His promises to unfold and keep seeking Him and doing good, even when we feel tired or discouraged. Let our hope always rest in His Word and in the presence of Jesus, our anchor and our guide.
