FREEDOM FOREVER

The Fourth of July is a day that holds deep significance for every American. It marks the moment, all the way back in 1776, when our nation boldly declared its independence from Britain. On that day, with the signing of the Declaration of Independence, America proclaimed to the world: *We will be free*. But how free was that freedom, really?

It's a sobering thought that the day we now celebrate with fireworks and cookouts was, for many of the 56 signers of the Declaration, the beginning of tremendous personal sacrifice. Five were captured by the British and tortured before being executed. Twelve had their homes looted and burned.

At the Battle of Yorktown, Thomas Nelson Jr. watched his own house be taken over by British General Cornwallis and used as enemy headquarters. Rather than hold back, Nelson urged General George Washington to open fire—on his own home. It was destroyed, and Nelson later died bankrupt.

Francis Lewis had his property destroyed, and his wife was captured and imprisoned by the British. She died in captivity. Carter Braxton, once a wealthy Virginia planter and trader, lost his ships to the British Navy. He was forced to sell his estate and died in poverty. Two other signers lost their sons in the war. Another saw both of his sons taken prisoner. In the end, nine of the 56 died from wounds or hardships suffered during the Revolutionary War. When we look at the true cost of our independence, it becomes clear: **freedom is never free**. Our liberty today was purchased with pain, courage, and sacrifice. As Americans, we should never forget that the freedoms we enjoy came at great cost.

But as meaningful as these sacrifices are, there is one sacrifice greater than them all, a sacrifice not made for a single nation, but for the entire world. One that didn't just secure freedom from political tyranny, but from something even more enslaving: **sin**. In **John 8:31–32**, Jesus said, "If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." Yet, those who heard Him were confused. "We're Abraham's descendants," they said. "We've never been slaves to anyone. What do you mean by 'set free'?" So, Jesus clarified in **John 8:34–36**: "Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who practices sin is a slave to sin. The slave does not remain in the house forever; the son remains forever. So, if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed." It's easy—even as Americans, living in the "land of the free"—to forget that we can still be enslaved. Not by foreign power, but by the power of sin. Sin keeps us bound in guilt, fear, and separation from God. But Jesus came to break those chains. Paul writes in **Galatians 5:1**: "For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery." When Jesus was betrayed, unfairly tried, mocked, beaten, and crucified, He took upon Himself the punishment we deserved (Isaiah 53:5). He paid the debt we owed. **Our freedom from sin was not free. It came at the highest cost.**

Now, imagine being back during the days of the American Revolution. Imagine if, after years of war and unimaginable sacrifice, the leaders of early America had simply gone back to King George in 1783—after the peace treaty was signed—and asked to be taken under British rule again. How senseless would that have been? All the suffering and progress would have been for nothing.

That's exactly what happens when someone who has been baptized into Christ chooses to return to a life of sin. It's going back to the very bondage Jesus died to save us from. 1 Peter 2:16-17 urges, "Live as people who are free, not using your freedom as a cover-up for evil, but living as servants of God. Honor everyone. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the emperor." Freedom in Christ is not a license to sin-it is a call to live for God. Paul echoes this truth in **Romans 6:1–4**: "What shall we say then? Are we continuing in sin that grace may abound? By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus was baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life."

So, as we celebrate the Fourth of July this week grilling out, watching fireworks, enjoying the blessings of our country—let's pause to remember the cost of our national freedom. But even more importantly, let's reflect on the greater freedom offered through Christ. He died to give us life. He rose to set us free. If you've been baptized into His death, walk in *newness of life*. Live in the freedom He purchased for you. And share that hope with others—because the good news of Jesus is the only freedom that lasts forever. "So, if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed." John 8:36 Andrew Spivey
