VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

I am EXTREMELY excited for Vacation Bible School this year. It will be held **July 16-19** each evening and the theme is Dream. During this time, we will be going through the account of Joseph's life, and I want to encourage everyone to be here each night. As we have prepared and studied for this VBS, I am amazed at how much we are able to learn about God's providence and character through the life of Joseph.

Even more so, I am continually amazed at how God put together His Word. He could have simply given us a list of truths and instructions, and that would have been more than enough. But instead, in His incredible wisdom, He chose to *show* us these truths in powerful, unforgettable ways.

God, who never lies (**Titus 1:2**), has promised His children that He will *always* be with them. David wrote that God "will not let your foot be moved; he who keeps you will not slumber... The sun shall not strike you by day, nor the moon by night" (**Psalm 121:3**, 6). Jesus told His apostles, "And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (**Matthew 28:20**). And the writer of Hebrews reminds us of God's words: "I will never leave you nor forsake you" (**Hebrews 13:5**).But God doesn't just say it, He *shows* it over and over again through the lives of His people. One of the clearest examples of this is found in the life of Joseph.

Joseph's story begins with God giving him dreams at a young age—visions of his brothers' sheaves and even the sun, moon, and stars bowing to him. These weren't just dreams; they were messages from God. But rather than celebrate him, his brothers hated him. "So they hated him even more for his dreams and for his words" (Genesis 37:8). They mocked him as "the dreamer" (Genesis 37:19), plotted to kill him, threw him into a pit, and eventually sold him into slavery. Even then, God never left him.

Imagine how Joseph must have felt—betrayed, alone, afraid—yet Scripture says, "The Lord was with Joseph, and he became a successful man" (Genesis 39:2). Though his life took a painful turn, God remained at his side, bringing purpose and blessing even in the darkest moments. That's who our Heavenly Father is. He *cannot* and *will not* abandon those who love Him. Even when we can't feel His presence, He is still there. And if you want more proof, look at how God was always with Joseph, no matter the circumstance.

Not only was God with Joseph through his betrayal by his brothers and being sold to Potiphar, but God was also there when Joseph stood firm in integrity, refusing the sinful advances of Potiphar's wife, and ended up in prison because of it. Even then, Scripture says, "*The Lord was with Joseph*" (Genesis 39:2, 3, 21, 23).

God was with Joseph when he interpreted the dreams of Pharaoh's baker and cupbearer. When the cupbearer forgot to keep his promise to remember Joseph when he returned to the palace. When Joseph was finally called to stand before Pharaoh, thirteen years after being sold into Egypt, his faith had not wavered. And in that moment, God elevated him to second-in-command over all of Egypt.

God's hand was still guiding him when his brothers first came, and he hid his identity from them. When his brothers returned...when he used wisdom in dealing so wisely with his brothers... when he revealed himself to his brothers... when he first saw his father... when Goshen became the Israelites' land... when his father blessed his sons... and even when Joseph buried his father, God was with him.

And in one of Joseph's final requests, we hear the echo of unshaken faith: "God will surely visit you, and you shall carry up my bones from here" (Genesis 50:25). He knew God had not forgotten His promise—and never would. Joseph's life is not just a story of endurance. It's a vivid reminder that God never forsakes His people. Not in the pit. Not in slavery. Not in prison. Not in loss. Not waiting. So, the next time life feels unfair or you're walking through a dark moment, remember Joseph. And more importantly, remember this unshakable truth: God has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you."
