LEAN ON THE TRUTH

I am beyond excited for this week of Vacation Bible School! VBS has always held a special place in my heart. Ever since I was a child, I've looked forward to it every summer—and that excitement hasn't faded with age. In fact, this year I'm more excited than ever, because we're doing something truly special: a fully immersive experience.

This week, we're stepping back in time, about 3,500 years, to the bustling heart of an Egyptian marketplace. Adults and children alike will get to see, hear, smell and feel what life may have been like in the days of Joseph. From the sounds of trade to the sights of ancient culture, we'll experience the account of and the world around one of the Bible's most remarkable stories.

As you explore and enjoy the week, I encourage you also to take a moment to thank the many people who made this possible. Countless hours, talents, and prayers went into creating this experience. Much of the work happened behind the scenes, but their impact is felt everywhere. From building and decorating to preparing lessons, they poured themselves into making this week unforgettable, so that together, we can bring the pages of Scripture to life. With all of the work that I have witnessed behind the scenes, it reminds me also of how God truly works.

Scripture makes a powerful and comforting statement in **James 1:17**, "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change." While we may sometimes struggle to recognize what is *truly* good, we can be absolutely confident of this: every genuinely good and perfect gift has its source in God. There has never been a blessing, large or small, that didn't originate from our heavenly Father. One of the beautiful aspects of reading Scripture is seeing how God works quietly, consistently, and purposefully behind the scenes to bring about His blessings for His people. A powerful example of this is found in the life of **Joseph**.

Long before anyone understood what God was doing, He gave Joseph two prophetic dreams. In the first, Joseph saw his brothers' sheaves of grain bowing down to his. When he shared the dream, "they hated him even more for his dreams and for his words" (Genesis 37:8). In the second dream, "the sun, the moon, and eleven stars were bowing down" to him. His father, Jacob, responded with disbelief, "What is this dream that you have dreamed? Shall I and your mother and your brothers indeed come to bow ourselves to the ground before you?" (Genesis 37:10)

Looking back, we know exactly how these dreams were fulfilled. But at the time, neither Jacob, Joseph, nor his brothers could have imagined how God's plan would unfold. The betrayal of his brothers, the false accusations from Potiphar's wife, years of imprisonment, and a devastating famine, none of it looked like a blessing at the moment. But all of it was under God's control. Years later, Joseph looked his brothers in the eyes and said: "God sent me before you to preserve life... As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today" (Genesis 45:5; 50:20)

Now, someone might shrug and foolishly say, "Joseph's family sure got lucky that he ended up ruling Egypt." But this wasn't luck, it was God working behind the scenes. How do we know it was God who was at work? Because He revealed it through Joseph's dreams from the very beginning.

The truth is the only way we can be certain that God is behind a specific event is if He tells us so. Without divine revelation, we can't claim that any individual moment is absolutely caused by God's intervention. Mordecai understood this when he spoke to Esther at a critical turning point for her people: "And who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?" (Esther 4:14) We may not always get a direct answer to why something happens. But that's okay. We don't need to see behind every curtain. It is enough to trust this truth: every good and perfect gift comes from our Father above. By leaning upon that truth, we can simply be immersed in God and all that He has in store for us. We can be thankful to have a loving Heavenly Father who is always working behind the scenes. **Andrew Spivey**
