### WHERE WILL YOU BE?

Around this time last year, I had an experience that made me feel rather unsafe. I walked out to my truck one morning and noticed the door was unlocked. At first, I thought I had forgotten to lock it the night before. But as I opened the door, I saw loose change scattered on the ground and my center console wide open—I had been robbed. Thankfully, I don't keep much of value in my vehicle, so the thief only got away with about a dollar in change. Still, the feeling of violation lingered. That very week, I installed security cameras and lights outside to make sure it didn't happen again. If they did return, I would be prepared next time.

One of life's unavoidable realities is the need for physical security. Businesses often spend anywhere from \$1,000 to \$10,000 on security systems, plus around \$300 a month just to help deter theft. The average homeowner may spend \$500 upfront with a \$50 monthly fee. We install locks, bolts, bars, and video doorbells in hopes of protecting our homes. On top of that, we have to worry about electronic and identity theft. Almost every vehicle today comes with locks and alarms.

And yet, even with all these precautions, burglary is still rampant. According to crimepreventiontips.com, a burglary occurs every 15 seconds in the U.S.—that's about 4,800 burglaries every single day, adding up to nearly 2.5 million burglaries a year and around \$3.4 billion in stolen property. What's the conclusion? It is nearly impossible to predict when a thief will strike, and just as hard to completely prevent it. But thieves and robbers are nothing new. They've been around since the beginning of time, which is why Jesus used them as an illustration to describe the end of the world. Matthew 24:42-44 says, "Therefore, stay awake, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But know this, if the master of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore, you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect."

What point is Jesus making? We can learn something from modern burglary statistics: most break-ins happen between 10 AM and 3 PM, when homeowners are typically away. If you knew a thief was coming on a certain day, you'd likely take off work to make sure your house was safe. If I had known my truck was going to be broken into that night, I would have stayed up and been

ready. The problem is that thieves come when you least expect it. And the same is true of Christ's return.

A thief takes advantage when people let their guard down. That's why God calls us to stay alert, always ready for the coming of the Lord. Paul reminded the church in Thessalonica of this truth: "But you are not in darkness, brothers, for that day to surprise you like a thief. For you are all children of light, children of the day. We are not of the night or of the darkness. So then let us not sleep, as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober." (2 Thessalonians 5:4–6)

Jesus said in John 14:1-4, "Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me. In my Father's house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also. And you know the way to where I am going." With the wonderful expectation of Christ's return, we can be encouraged, comforted, and built up together. But let us not get comfortable. Let us not spiritually doze off and think that all is good. Peter says in 2 Peter 3:10-12 "But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a roar, and the heavenly bodies will be burned up and dissolved, and the earth and the works that are done on it will be exposed. Since all these things are thus to be dissolved, what sort of people ought you to be in lives of holiness and godliness, waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be set on fire and dissolved, and the heavenly bodies will melt as they burn!"

Since we know that all of this will end then let us make sure that we are living in Christ and following what is eternal. Because, unlike thief's, when it comes to the end of the world and Christ's return, there will not be a next time to be ready. Paul tells us in **2** Corinthians **6:2**, "In a favorable time I listened to you, and in a day of salvation I have helped you." Behold, now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation." Where will you be when the thief comes? Will you be ready and waiting, or will you be asleep? More importantly, where will you be on the day of Christ's return? Will you be anticipating and joyful, or will you be fearful and unprepared?
