FELLOWSHIP

A few weeks ago, I was putting Palmer to bed, and as she climbed in, she started talking about how much she loved her bed. She loved how soft it was and how many pillows she had. She loved the way it smelled and how cozy it felt. Then, as she laid back and rested her head on the pillow, she let out a big sigh and said, "I feel so inconspicuous."

Now, I must admit, she did look a little inconspicuous, buried under her comforter, surrounded by pillows, and snuggled in with ten stuffed animals. But clearly, she did not actually know what the word inconspicuous meant.

That is something we all do, right? We think we know a word, but over time we lose the depth of its meaning as we try to use it in other ways. One word that comes to mind is literally. Over the years, literally has come to mean much more than what it literally means. With that in mind, I wonder how many words we use in our spiritual lives that we may not fully understand the depth of.

For example, how many of us truly understand what fellowship means? It's a word we often hear in Christian teaching, but do we stop to consider its depth? When I think of fellowship, my mind quickly goes to the idea of relationship, because real fellowship requires relationship. Yet, I have often rushed past the beautiful simplicity of this truth.

John reminds us: "Indeed, our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ" (1 John 1:3). It's tempting to substitute "fellowship" with the word "relationship" and keep moving, but if we do, we actually miss something important.

Acts 2 gives us a fuller picture of fellowship. Acts 2:44-45 says," And all who believed were together and had all things in common. And they were selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to all, as any had need". That word "common" comes from the Greek word koinos, the root of koinonia, meaning fellowship. That may not seem like a big deal on the surface, but the significance is powerful: if I have fellowship with God and He with me, then all of God's resources are available to me—and all that I am, belongs fully to Him.

This truth makes **Ephesians 1:3** shine even brighter: "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places." Every blessing of heaven such as God's love, grace, mercy, patience, and promises is poured out to us through fellowship. And Jesus makes this clear: "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" (John 14:6).

But fellowship is not one-sided. Just as all of God is available to us, all of who we are should be surrendered to Him. Galatians 2:20 says," I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.". True fellowship means open, honest, and complete devotion to God.

And the opposite is also true. John warns us in 1 John 1:6" If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth". Paul asks, in 2 Corinthians 6:14, "What fellowship has light with darkness?". The answer is clear, none. Darkness and fellowship with God cannot exist together. Even nature itself reflects this truth. To be outside fellowship with God is to be outside His blessings, and being outside His blessings means that you have no part of Him. How tragic would it be to think that you have a relationship with God, but you truly don't have fellowship because you have not truly given yourself to Him. Jesus explains what this will be like for those who don't have true fellowship. In Matthew 7:21-23 Jesus says, "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord, 'will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven. On that day many will say to me, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and cast out demons in your name, and do many mighty works in your name? 'And then will I declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from me, you workers of lawlessness.'
